
### Grammar note:

Forming the future tense in Arabic is very simple. All you need to do is to **add the prefix**  $\smile$  (s) to the verb in the present tense.

As you've learned in a previous lesson, in order to **negate** a verb in future tense, we use  $\overset{\iota}{\cup}$  (lan). When negating, we **do not add** the prefix  $\overset{\iota}{\cup}$  (s).

There is also another way to express future in Arabic, which you will learn in the following lesson.
