

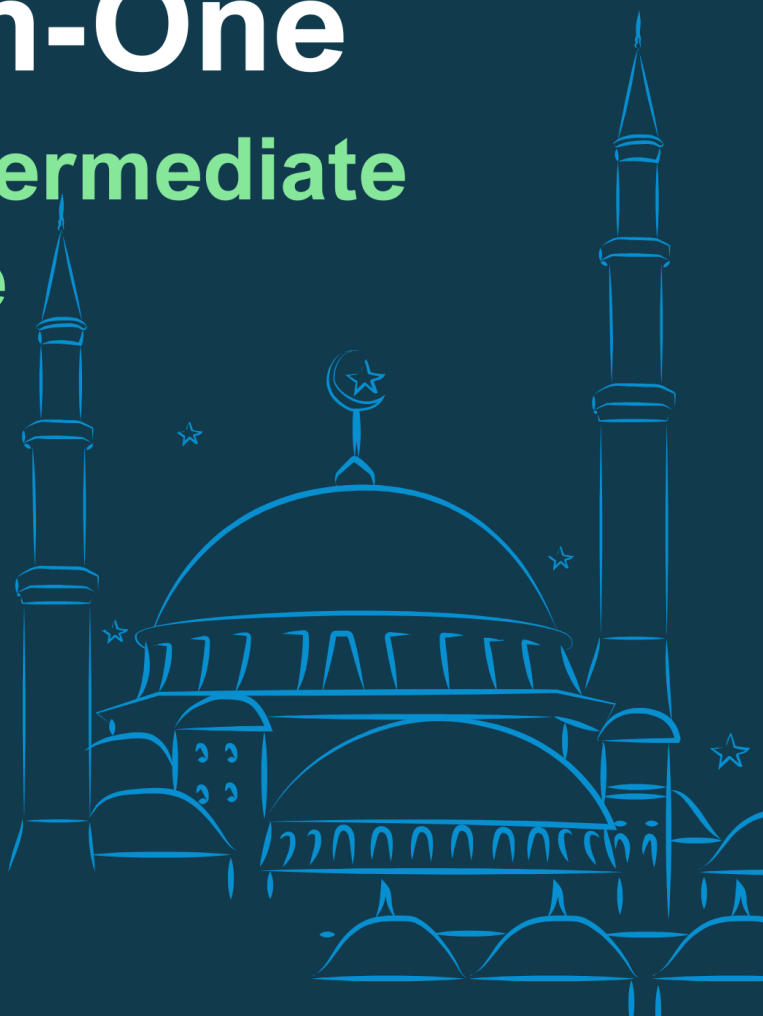

4 Future - verb <to be> ▶ GRAMMAR

Grammar note:

Forming the future tense in Arabic is very simple. All you need to do is to **add the prefix س (s)** to the verb in the present tense.

Future tense = س (s) + *present tense*

As you've learned in a previous lesson, in order to **negate** a verb in future tense, we use **لن (lan)**. When negating, we **do not add the prefix س (s)**.

There is also another way to express future in Arabic, which you will learn in the following lesson.
