

3 Ordinal numbers ▶ GRAMMAR

Grammar note:

In order to form ordinal numbers in Arabic, first we **take the root** of the name of the cardinal number. The root usually consists of three consonants. Then we turn the root into a so-called *form I active participle*, which in simple words means - we **add an I (alif)** in **the second place**. Don't worry, it's easier than it sounds! Here's an example:

Ordinals in Arabic have both **masculine and feminine forms**. The feminine form is formed by adding §.

Please note that *first* is an exception.

Ordinal numbers for tens 20-90 are **the same** as their cardinal form, but with a definite article 3 (al) added to them.
